



Research Space Evaluation Criteria

The following are criteria that may, as applicable, be used in the evaluation process (by Department Chairs, School Directors, College Deans, and the Vice President for Research) when making decisions about research space allocation:

- List of externally funded awards in the last five years, including direct and indirect costs
- List of externally funded proposals submitted in the last five years that were not funded, including direct and indirect costs
- Number of research publications and scholarly works (books, essay collections, or journal articles [along with an index or appropriate measure of the quality of the work]) in the last three years
- Number of creative products in the past three years (including art exhibitions, concerts, dramatic performances, music scores, films, as well as published poetry, drama, or fiction)
- Intellectual property disclosures, patents, licenses, start-ups
- Number of undergraduate, masters, and doctoral students currently engaged in the research space
- Number of undergraduate, masters, and doctoral students whom you mentored and who graduated in the last five years
- Faculty and student research-related awards and honors (for example, keynote speeches, invited presentations, or best paper awards) in the last five years
- Outreach efforts and successes to industry, other institutions, and/or the community in the last five years
- Future plans/initiatives

The above research space evaluation criteria only apply to tenured faculty.
