

Mapping a Drive on Windows 10

To map drives, you must be using a computer on-campus or be connected to the University's VPN. Instructions for doing so may be found <u>here</u>.

Step 1

To begin mapping a drive, click the Start Menu in the bottom left corner of your screen, then begin typing **This PC**. When This PC appears, click on it.

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Step 2

Click the Computer tab in the toolbar, then click Map network Drive.



Step 3

In the Map Network Drive window, choose a letter that will identify your drive on this PC. In the **Folder** text box, enter the server path as shown below. Check the boxes for **Reconnect at sign-in** and **Connect using different credentials**.

Enter csunet\(Your CSU ID) in the first field, for example: csunet\1234567. Enter your password in the second field, then check the box for **Remember my credentials** and click **OK**.
